Breakthrough entered its 15th Year in 2022, offering Spring and Fall classes and mentorships. Nine participants graduated.

The participants, upon entering the intensive 12-week, 24 session program, have a clear understanding of their commitment. With the help provided by volunteer mentors and educational workshops, they focus on the factors that contributed to their homelessness, learn from the tools provided, and work with confidence to achieve their personal goals. These goals typically include moving into stable housing (including Mercy Haven's housing), finding employment, enrolling in college and remaining active in regular follow-up classes. Congratulations to our Graduates!

A TIME TO LEARN TOGETHER

The supportive 'wraparound' services Mercy Haven provides to our housing residents are key to their success,



in both maintaining their housing and realizing their potential. For many of our residents, this may mean intensive one-on-one services, for many others, it means learning together and peer support. Our Resident Empowerment and Achievement Programming (REAP) provides monthly calendars filled with opportunities for residents to come together, socialize and learn important topics from our staff and volunteers.

In 2022, our REAP calendar offered on average 24 activities per month, for our adults, children and families. We were fortunate to have Project Hope offer regular classes, as well as Northwell Health, with the large focus of the year being physical health. Thirty-five percent of our residents are living with a chronic medical condition, making fitness classes, health & wellness, and nutritional classes of high importance, along with various other activities for companionship and learning.

This celebration aligned with our notification of winning a spot on the list of Long Island's Top Workplaces for 2022.






22ND ANNUAL GOLF OUTING

CEREMONY TO CELEBRATE OPENING

A beautiful October day greeted many guests to celebrate the opening of Mercy Gardens, our

much anticipated supportive housing project. Representatives from the Homeless Housing and Assistance Program (HHAP), the government program responsible for granting \$5.1 of the project's \$5.9 million needed, were present to receive our thanks. Added capital funding from the Office of Mental Health provided nearly \$118,000. The project also received more than \$310,00 from the Federal Home Loan Bank of New York, and Mercy Haven contributed more than \$340,000. Town of Islip Supervisor, Angie Carpenter, and many other dignitaries, staff, and Board members were able to share in this memorable day.

In closing, Sister Pat stated, "We are thrilled with the outcome of this project. Today we want to express our gratitude for the strong partnerships with the Homeless Housing and Assistance Program, the Office of Mental Health and the Federal Home Loan Bank of New York. Without these connections, 28 formerly homeless adults and children would still be looking for a place to live."





Moves for Mental Health and Housing

Governor Hochul's 2023 State of the State Address included long-overdue initiatives for Mental Health care and housing that could change the way we represent, care for and house those living with mental illness.

The multi-year plan includes increasing operational capacity by 1,000 beds for inpatient psychiatric treatment, creating 3,500 units of housing over the next five years to serve New Yorkers with mental illness, increasing insurance coverage for mental health services, dramatically expanding outpatient services, and creating systemic accountability for hospital admissions and discharges to better address the needs of individuals suffering with mental illness. These proposals, over time, will reflect more than a \$1 billion investment in mental health. Since Long Island is counted as part of Metro New York, there will be competition for proper funding, assuming it will be open bids.

In the coming weeks, the Governor will be releasing her executive budget proposal, which will start budget negotiations in anticipation of a final budget being agreed on by April 1. According to our Advocacy Partners, the Association for Community Living (ACL), even with the additions to mental health housing funding in 2022, the Office of Mental Health housing programs, a large part of Mercy Haven's housing structure, are still underfunded.

We continue to work with ACL to advocate for proper funding for mental health needs and the importance of solution-driven housing. The State of the State Address is a hopeful start.

"For years, we have been advocating that housing is the foundation for recovery. The States' recognition of this by making mental health housing a priority is unprecedented! We are grateful for this new investment.

However, there are still many challenges for providers as we move into the new year. Director of Behavioral From staff shortages to inflation, and aging

residents with many medical conditions, Mercy Haven will continue to advocate and work with both local and State officials to develop solutions that meet the needs of our most vulnerable individuals."

GRANT PROVIDES FOR EXPANSION OF OUR LIFE-CHANGING SERVICES ON LONG ISLAND

Mercy Haven was recently awarded \$75,000 from the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation to support a 20% increase in residents under our care in 2023.

"When we develop homes, that is the first piece of a much larger puzzle" said S. Pat, Executive Director, "Housing is the first step to ending homelessness. The support and advocacy our staff provide allow for our residents' stability and personal development. In order for us to do this, we rely on, and seek support from, understanding donors like the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation."

This funding will support staff and service expansion for our latest project of new construction, providing homes for 28 adults and children. Additionally, we purchased and renovated three more multi-family homes in Suffolk County to house 8 families. Residents will be provided life skills development, legal advocacy services, child & family intervention, emotional support, employment opportunities, peer support groups, and recreation.

"We know that the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation understands that attaining stability for crisis populations can be complex. It relies on the quality and adequacy of our services," said Donna O'Hearon, "We are grateful to have them as a partner in 2023 as we grow and help more people."

The Mother Cabrini Health Foundation is a private, nonprofit organization whose mission is to improve the health and well-being of New Yorkers, bolster the health outcomes of vulnerable communities, eliminate barriers to care, and bridge gaps in health services. Named after a tireless advocate for

immigrants, children, and the poor, the Mother Cabrini Health Foundation funds programs and initiatives across New York State that either provide direct healthcare services or address the social determinants of health.
